Many of you have come to my office and noticed many dog toys strewn all over my floor.

You may have even met my new puppy, Kaiba (kye-bah). It has been my dream since 2010 to have a therapy dog. A therapy dog is not a service dog. It's a dog that has been trained to go into places with their owners like assisted living homes, schools, and hospitals to provide care and comfort for others. A service dog is specially trained to help a person who has a disability like a seeing eye dog. Kaiba and I will begin obedience and behavior training April 25. We have 12 weeks of training before we will be able to take the therapy dog test. We cannot do that until she is 1 year old, which will be Dec. 1.

With the goal of Kaiba being a therapy dog, it has been very important for me to work on her socialization as a puppy. That is one reason I have been bringing her to the office. She needs to meeting people, especially men. She has quite a few women in her life and very few men. Thank you so much to everyone who helped her be more

comfortable around people, especially the youth. Thank you, everyone, for your understanding. I am so fortunate to be able to bring my puppy to work.

Kaiba is a Portuguese Water Dog, which is same breed President Obama had in the White House.



I chose this breed specifically because they are hypoallergenic, which means Kaiba does not have fur but has hair. She does not shed and does not have much dander making her less likely to trigger people who are allergic to dogs. Portuguese Water Dogs are a very friendly breed with all ages and with other animals. They are very intelligent, are easy to train and have high energy. This is why

I chose this breed. Kaiba will be about 50 pounds as an adult making her a medium sized dog.

"The Portuguese Water Dog once lived all along Portugal's coast, and was used to herd fish into nets, retrieve lost tackle, and act as a messenger between ships and shore. Fishermen counted on the strong and muscular dogs to be hardworking and seaworthy. They would ride in boats from the warm Atlantic waters of Portugal to the freezing cold waters off the coast of Iceland. Technology eventually laid them off of their job, but the breed is still used for water rescue." (www.akc.org)




Congratulations, Stetson!
