Trust and patience seem to go hand in hand in the time of the in-between. We take the steps of ange and wait to see what will

change and wait to see what will happen. In movies, the time in-between the prayer and outcome, the risk and conclusion is so small. In real life, that time can seem like forever. It's easy to lose patience. It's easy to lose our trust in God. The Israelites felt the same way when they were in exile. How long will they have to wait? Isaiah urged the people to be patient and trust in God. Isaiah 40:28-31, "Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. God does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted, but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint." Being patient and trusting God was difficult for the Israelites and I don't

think we are very different from them!

One of our goals for this year was to increase our social media presence. Historically, we would reach out to television news stations and local newspapers to promote our church and events. However, more and more people are online. Platforms like Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Snapchat, are the ways people are interacting with the world around them. It's the cheapest, easiest, and best way to reach people.

The Church Council is aware of this and has dedicated \$2000 to marketing this year. The Foundation has awarded us \$1000 as well. This past month, we ran an advertisement on Facebook for our church and increased our followers by 625 and gained 613 likes. Being a follower means when we post something to our page, it will automatically be shown to our followers. Following a page keeps you up to date on all the latest news. "Liking" a page means you support the page and the organization. Followers and likes are like endorsements, thus the more

endorsements we have, the more likely people will choose us over other similar organizations. We are so excited that, within a month, we have a total of 683 likes and 733 followers.

So now what? Are we going to see more people on Sundays? Are we going to see more people attending our online service? We hope so, but we cannot guarantee that. We have entered that in-between time when we are patient and trust in God. The reason we are so excited about these new likes and followers is because it means people are aware of us and are interested in what we have to offer. Perhaps they will spend years following us and just watching from afar. It's their faith journey. We are called by God to welcome and be here when people are ready to begin or continue their faith journey. People are learning that we are here, that we are a supportive and loving church who loves Jesus and is engaged in our community.

Now what? Now let's continue to brainstorm ways we can serve the needs of our community. Let's keep brainstorming ways to connect with people who are worshipping and watching us online. This social media and online aspect of church is new, which means we are being church in new and exciting ways. Let's keep getting outside the walls of the church and telling people about First Lutheran Church!

It's an exciting time for First Lutheran as our online presence continues to grow!

Imagine Eleven Concert Series

Imagine Eleven wraps up its tenth year! We averaged 410 people per concert; however, two nights were rained out and three nights were hosted by First Lutheran due to weather. Thus, our attendance was not what we had hoped. We raised \$3000 from the "passing of the bucket" donations which went to The Crossing Nutrition Center. Our goal was \$5000, which gives us incentive to create an even more dynamic event next year. We were so happy to partner with Youth Alliance in the concession stand and Community Missions with the snow cones stand. Youth Volunteer Corps of Youth Alliance made \$2,566.44 this year, which will pay for their trip to the Youth Volunteer Corp Summit in Tulsa, OK. They have agreed to run the concessions stand again next year! Our hope is to continue to partner with notfor-profit organizations in St. Joseph to help fundraise, promote, and, in the future, provide volunteer sign up opportunities.


One goal for Pastor Sami and Brooke was to double the number of followers and likes on the Imagine Eleven Facebook page. We increased our followers by 1,277 and our likes by 1,242, well surpassing our goal. We now have a total of 2,219 likes and 2,291 followers. The word is getting out about Imagine Eleven. In our advertising, we focused on connecting First Lutheran to Imagine Eleven. First Lutheran *presents* Imagine Eleven, which many people did not realize. They also did

not realize that no donated money to Imagine Eleven comes to the church. *All proceeds* go back into the community. We also wanted people to understand the mission of Imagine Eleven which is, "music that brings community and service together."

This fall, we are putting together a board to help plan the event for next year to make it even more successful. We hope to have more raffle items, children's activities, and not-for-profit organizations involved to help increase awareness of how we can all serve our community. We are so excited for the future of the Imagine Eleven *Summer* Concert series.

Wait, it's not just in the summer, anymore. Imagine Eleven Concert Series is expanding. We are hosting Surfin' USA on Nov. 11 at the Missouri Theater. We will also honor our Veterans during this concert. Proceeds will go to The Crossing Nutrition Center. Tickets cost between \$10 to \$25. Get your tickets at jomotickets.com.


