# November Handclasp Newsletter

#### **From Pastor Sami**

I went to the Central States Synod, "Theological Conference" this past month and learned about a study done

by Baylor University that discovered Americans believe in four perceptions of God: Authoritarian, Benevolent, Critical and Distant. They surveyed 1,721 people and found the majority believed in God or a divine being yet understood God differently. An authoritarian God is highly engaged in our lives and in the world and is also highly judgmental and stern. The benevolent God is like the authoritarian God; however, sees God as less angry and more positive and forgiving. The critical God is a distant observer and punishes when needed. And finally, there is the distant God who is not active or interested in the world at all. Of those surveyed, 31.4% believe in an authoritative God. 23% a benevolent God. 16% a critical God and 24.4% in a distant God. Paul Froese, a Baylor University sociology professor and researcher said,

"The higher your income, the less likely you are to think God is angry... The lower your income, the more likely you are to think God is angry. Gender is another big relationship. Women tend much toward the benevolent God. Men are more likely to think God is angry..." The question these four perceptions of God raise is, "How is God active in our everyday lives?" Froese says, "A person's [perception of] God is a direct reflection of [their] level of moral absolutism, view of science, understanding of economic justice, concept of evil and how [they] think we should respond to it." This is what every writer in the Bible was trying to understand; who is God, what is God doing in the world and how are we a part of it? How we answer that question helps us better understand our views and how we should behave. When we go through times of trial, we rely on these perceptions of God to help us understand the world around us. Perhaps by understanding someone's perception of God, we are better able to understand their perception of the world around them and why they believe and act the way they do. These perceptions

are formed in childhood from our parents' and family views and our experiences in church. As we continue in our journey of faith, we begin to have personal experiences with God. Froese says, "What we're finding is that people are sitting in the pews because they feel personally engaged with God or that God is personally engaged in their lives... It's really the personal relationship with God that brings them around and gets them involved." In the survey, only 5.2% of people identified as Atheist. People in the U.S. believe in God and many are trying to understand who God is, how is God active in the world and how are we a part of that? My question to First Lutheran is, "How can we help God and others to answer those questions.


Week 1: Sleep in heavenly peace (peace)


We are looking for old church directories. Please drop them off at the church office or bring them to worship and give them to the ushers. Thank you.

Each year, we ask the members of First Lutheran Church to think about their budgets and how much they can give to the church.


